
Prepare for the 2015 CDC Annual Meeting

Seminars explore song and scripture

This year, instead of the usual lineup of workshops, attendees will have the opportunity to attend one of two seminars during the CDC Annual Meeting.

THE ENGAGED SPIRITUALITY OF JESUS

Sing and celebrate with John Bell, a pastor and musician who breathes life into worship, music and the living Gospels. A much sought after speaker,



Rev. Bell is a member of the Iona Community, an evangelical community dedicated to working for peace and social justice, rebuilding of community, and renewal of worship. He travels the world reviving Christian worship.

Bell, of the Iona Community in Scotland—prolific composer, teacher on worship and music—will speak at Prairie Street Mennonite

Church (1316 Prairie St., Elkhart, Ind.) on **Saturday, June 13, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.**

Cost is \$20. CDC delegates who wish to participate in this seminar are asked to register for the event on the adult registration form. The seminar runs from 9 a.m. to noon, then breaks for lunch and resumes at 1:30 p.m. CDC participants may choose to attend one or both sessions of this seminar.

About Bell: John Bell is listed as composer, lyricist or arranger in 17 out of 118 songs in our Sing the Journey song book. That's nearly 15%!

John was born in Kilmarnock, and after ordination began his ministry with a post in youth work in Glasgow. He later joined the Iona Community, and with his colleague, Graham Maule, was drawn to concentrate on congregational song, liturgy and the sharing of scripture, a ministry which led to the Wild Goose Resource Group.

RETHINKING OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH EACH OTHER AND THE BIBLE

Since our founding, we Mennonites have claimed the Bible as the central source of authority for our faith and life. The Bible, we have said, is how we learn about God, and most importantly, about Jesus Christ, the One whom we together seek to follow.

Yet these days it seems many of us are not spending a whole lot of time with the Bible. "The estrange-



ment of many North American Mennonite Christians from the Bible—their sense that they know the book, that it's over-familiar or irrelevant, and their captivity to American ills of individualism, consumerism and overbusyness—all of these make it hard to indwell the ancient text and make it life-giving today," writes Alan Kreider.

And when it comes to difficult conversations like we're having about sexuality, some among us have little hope that Scripture can be our guide. Because the Scripture has been misused and co-opted for political purposes and made into a tool of oppression, they say we should steer clear of it in discerning difficult matters.

Others among us are quick to claim the Bible is on their side in the sexuality debates. They quote the Bible readily. They will tell you something like, "I go with the Bible on this one." This is code for, "There will be no discussion of inclusion or same sex covenants in my church. I know what the Bible says. Case closed."
