Missional Church Committee

The work of the Missional Church Committee is slow, patient, sometimes even frustrating work. As opposed to, for instance, the Gifts Discernment Committee, whose work consists of finding a particular number of people, by a particular date, to do particular jobs—the work of Missional Church Committee is far less taskoriented.

Our main focus is to help build up the conference by strengthening relationships (a) among CDC congregations, and (b) between CDC congregations and other people outside of the conference.

We recognize that there are many ways of being the Body of Christ; there are countless forms of church. And so, as a committee, our most important work is staying attentive. What are we hearing? Which congregations have expressed similar interests or challenges in their local contexts? How might we introduce them—perhaps at a CDC Regional Gathering? How might we support congregations in their shared visions—perhaps through a Reign of God grant? How might we join with groups outside of our conference—groups like the Poor People's Campaign—who are proclaiming the good news of God's liberation from the rulers of this world? The Missional Church Committee is a CDC ministry through and through. We know that congregations have much to share with one another in terms of prayers, stories and material resources. However, we don't presume to know what it is, precisely, that any individual congregation has to offer; nor do we know the best way that such sharing might occur. That all depends on the congregation—on their changing circumstances, and the needs of their neighbors. This type of work always invites participation; it is always unfinished.

Ministerial committee

he mission of the ministerial committee involves two main activities. First we provide support and help to Doug Luginbill, conference minister. Secondly we work with the credentialed leaders in our conference.

Doug has the responsibility of relating to all congregations within CDC in addition to the pastoral staff. With 41 congregations, that

can be a heavy load. In addition to pastoral staff we have a number of credentialed chaplains within CDC. We assist Doug as a committee by providing moral support and prayer support. In addition, much of the work includes licensing interviews for new pastors and chaplains. In most situations there are committee members who meet in person with the candidate along with Doug or we will video conference. Ordination interviews are also done as needed. We tend to the policies that relate to credentialed leaders as well.

The conference is blessed with a wide variety of credentialed leaders. As a committee we are in contact mostly when performing the interviews mentioned above. In addition, we relate to credentialed leaders at the Annual Meeting and the Pastor/Leader appreciation dinner. One aspect of what we do is to constantly evaluate what we can do to improve or strengthen relational accountability. It's important to us as a committee to know that we are doing what we can to support our credentialed leaders.
