CDC members graduate from seminary

Mennonite Church USA

Three students connected with Central District Conference congregations participated in the May 4 commencement service of Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary (AMBS), Elkhart, Indiana.

ratik Bagh of Kutela-Raipur, Chhattisgarh, India, graduated with a Master of Arts: Theological Studies. He was selected to receive this year's Student **Ambassador Recognition** Award for his contributions to a program in which international students



represent AMBS in constituent congregations. He anticipates working as lead pastor of an Indian Church in Pittsburgh, Pa., as part of a yearlong government-approved professional training program. He also will continue as an AMBS student in the Master of Divinity program, majoring in Theological Studies: History, Theology and Ethics.

Bagh previously earned a Bachelor in Theology and a Bachelor in Divinity from Allahabad Bible Seminary in Allahabad, Uttar Pradesh, India. He is a member of Jhilmila Mennonite Church in Jhilmila-Saraipali, Chhattisgarh, which is part of the General Conference Mennonite Church of India. He also is an associate member of Hively Avenue Mennonite Church in Elkhart. He and his wife, Shabnam Pratik Bagh, have one daughter, and his parents are Prem Kishor Bagh and Shubhkanti Bagh of Vill-Kutela Saraipali, Dist-Mahasamund, Chhattisgarh. Bagh's uncles, Anil Bagh (MATS



1996), are also AMBS graduates.

"The history and theology taught at AMBS in Anabaptist perspective are unique, and I found them very meaningful," Bagh said. "They not only informed me but also challenged me to grow in reliance on God and inspired me to take my share of responsibility towards my neighbor. It is a transforming experience to learn about some Anabaptists' core stances in the past as well as even today in the 21st century, such as pacifism."

Prior to coming to AMBS, Johns was a pastor and overseer in Allegheny Mennonite Conference and from 1993 to 2000, he was a professor of religion at Bluffton (Ohio) University.

Johns and his wife, Rachel, have attended Southside Fellowship in Elkhart. This fall, they will travel to SEMILLA, the Latin American Anabaptist seminary in Guatemala City, Guatemala, where they will serve as host and hostess of the Casa Emaús guesthouse and where he will teach some courses. After a year there, they will move to Stuart, Fla.
